Many of the designs are pretty, but unless you are really competent at diagnosing errors in lace patterns you may set aside your knitting in frustration. In addition there are often two, and sometimes more, repetitions of a pattern. Some of the patterns are unusual and lovely, and worth working through. The laces in the illustrations are not all to be found in the patterns in the book, so be prepared for disappointments here, too. The knitted samples were not starched or well pressed, and you cannot always get a true idea of what a pattern looks like until you have knitted several inches and starched and pressed it yourself. Originally published in 1987, this is a paperback edition of a collection of over 200 knitted lace patterns of Victorian

times which range from simple edgings to intricate laces. Suitable to trim tablecloths, bedspreads, towels, lampshades and blinds. Includes a brief description of the history of the craft; illustrated instructions for all the stitches used, photos of the finished edging for each pattern and colour photographs of trimmed articles. Includes a bibliography. The authors have also written 'Motifs, Borders and Trims in Classic Knitted Cotton'. Furze Hewitt has also written four knitting craft books.
