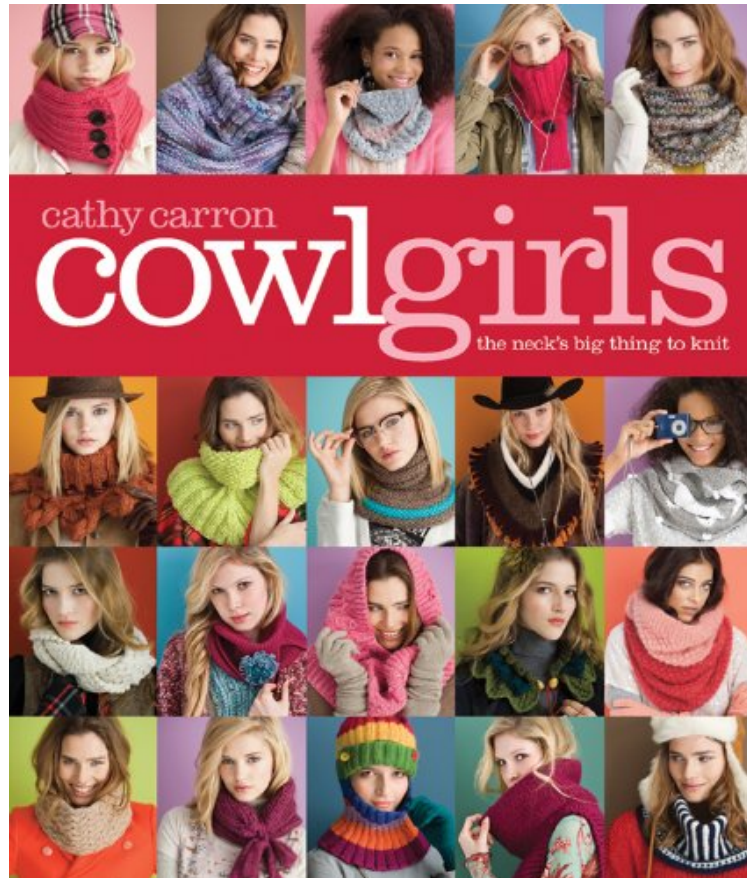

so I know that isn't an option available to everyone. I have never made an item out of the yarn it was designed for, so this is also not a problem. That said, I was disappointed that there were so many of them designed for bulky yarns. At a guess this was done to make them quick to knit, but I'm not happy with how big yarn works around my neck because my neck is shorter. All of that aside, I love this book because it has fired my imagination. I have lots of different ideas that I want to try based on these pieces. I do wish this had been available for the Kindle. I love having patterns available that way.

Forget tired scarves and bulky turtlenecks-funky, chunky, hip and happening cowls are where it's at! Following up her hit book *Hattitude*, author and designer Cathy Carron weaves a fashion statement that puts in-the-know women head and shoulders above the rest. Among the more than 35 patterns provided here are a cozy neck wrap featuring a built-in iPod holder, a lacy drawstring hood, and a woven necklace sparkling with Swarovski crystals.
