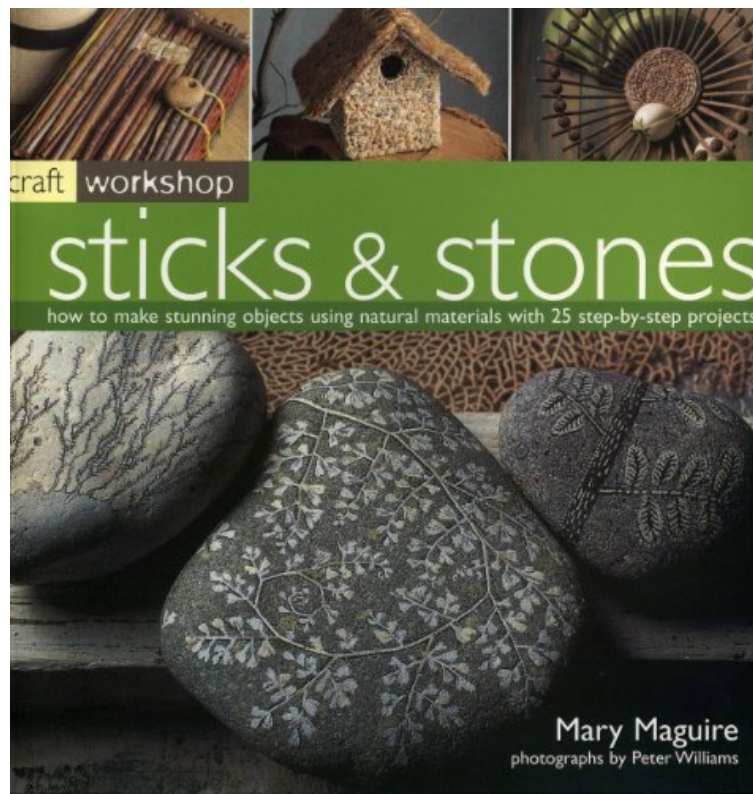

I would not have a child do any of them, though, unless careful hands-on supervision by an adult. The projects involve things like making jewelry from stones (involves drilling holes with high-power drills), making cement tiles with stone decorations, and constructing stick furniture. One of the easiest involves painting delicate pictures in black and white paint on rocks, and the results are stunning, though perhaps beyond the capabilities of many crafters. Nevertheless I find the book very inspirational
