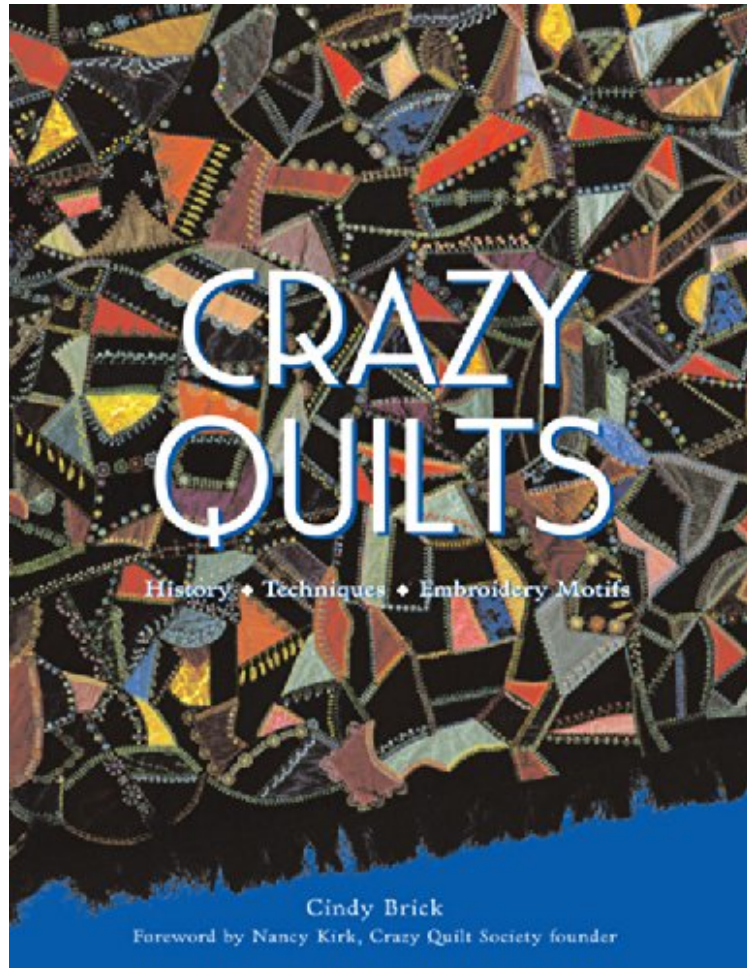

I have many books on Crazy Quilts, but this one is by far my favorite one. A lot of my other books have the same quilts as each other in the photos, but this book has the most interesting, beautifully photographed, large, and diverse Crazy Quilt photos that I have seen. It inspires me more than the last 5 books on Crazy Quilts that I ordered combined! I have spent at least 30 minutes just mind-boggled at the Madame Dragonfly quilt on page 39. True its main focus is on the history, not techniques of how to make a Crazy Quilt, but that is another reason why I love this book. I have spent many hours happily reading the fascinating and extremely well written history of the Crazy Quilt. The research, quilts presented, and writing is outstanding. Other books seem to have at best 1-2 brief paragraphs on the subject. I have been quite ill, and one of my doctors showed me the Crazy Quilt she was working on. I have wanted to take up some form of quilting, and got totally inspired to make a Crazy Quilt. But for now I am just reading about them since I don't feel up to making one right now. But the techniques presented in THIS book are the only ones I have seen that illustrate to the point where I understand it, things like how to actually attach the patches to the background fabric! All the main methods of construction are clearly presented. True the embroidery motifs section is brief, but I have an entire book devoted just to that. The basic stitches are here though.
