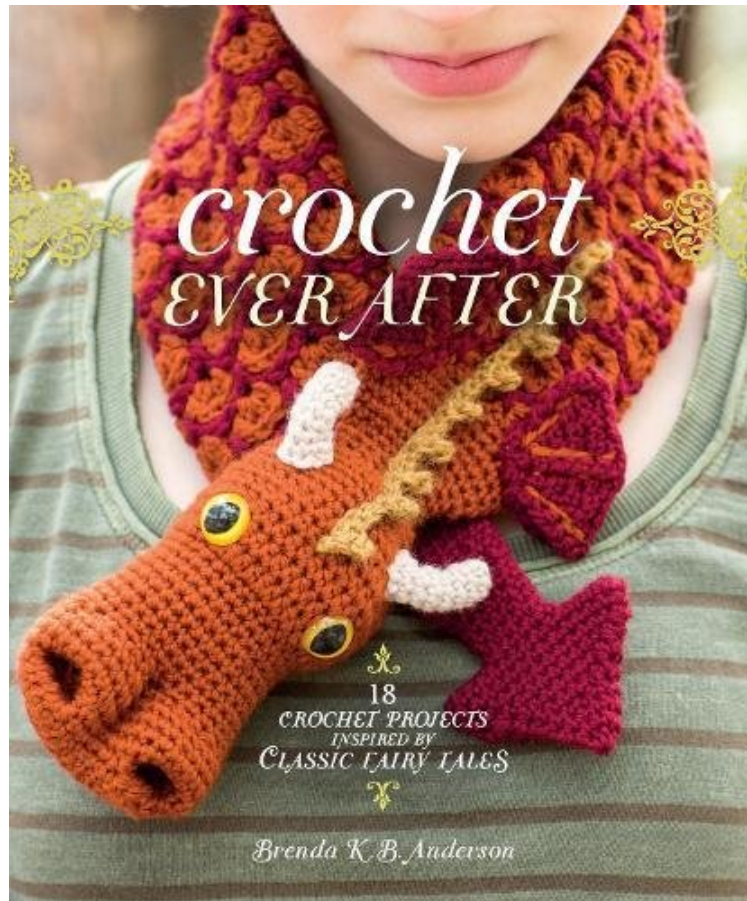

So far, I've only made the dragon neck warmer (although I've made four at this point), and have read through the directions on several other patterns. The ideas are cute, especially if you have kids or grandkids (or kids at heart, my mother is one of the recipients of the dragon neck warmer), but I'm questioning some of the editing. I am by no means a beginning crocheter, but had the devil's own time just trying to figure out some of her instructions. Definitely make use of the charts, they'll save you a lot of time, because I honestly felt that some of the written directions were ridiculously convoluted. If you like Brenda
