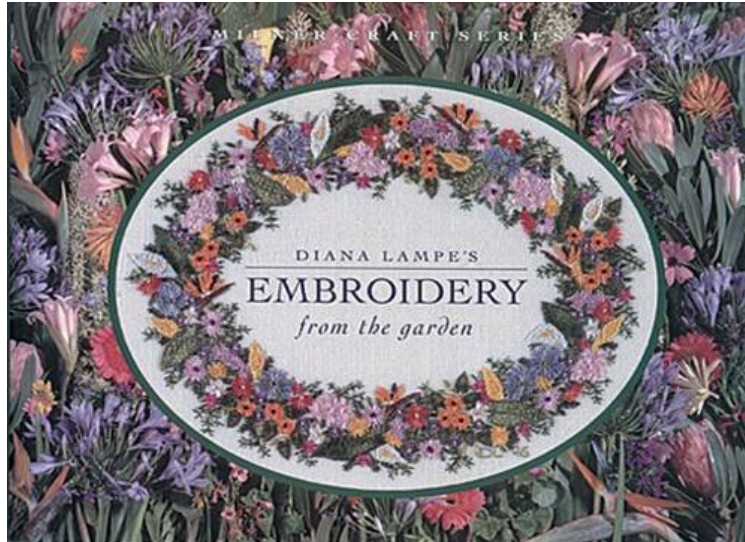

"Embroidery from the Garden" includes precise stitching directions, vivid color photos, and a variety of South African and Australian flowers to embroider in a number of projects. Lampe's original designs are easy to follow and a joy to replicate. The exotic flora of the tropic clime are listed by their botanical names (i.e., *Strelitzia reginae* --- Bird of Paradise, *Felicia amelloides* --- Blue Marguerite), and illustrated to capture the flower's essence. This exquisite book is perfect for anyone who is serious about embroidery. Take a minute to stop and stitch the Rhodohypoxis!

Diana now covers more exotic flowers in full colour, depicting two full gardens - the Protea and the Strelitzia Gardens. Full detailed instructions are given for embroidering each flower, including colour thread details and a full stitch glossary.

From Library Journal Although Lampe's third volume of embroidery designs (following Embroidered Garden Flowers, Sterling, 1994) was inspired by the flowers of South Africa, the flowers are common to gardens worldwide. Included

are 50 patterns not previously published and instructions for arranging the flowers into beautiful gardens. Common embroidery stitches have been carefully chosen to re-create the true form of each flower, with each requiring a meticulous embroidering effort to reproduce. The stitch glossary reviews techniques, standard embroidery thread colors and numbers are referenced throughout, and a flower glossary offers both popular and scientific names for the flowers.
