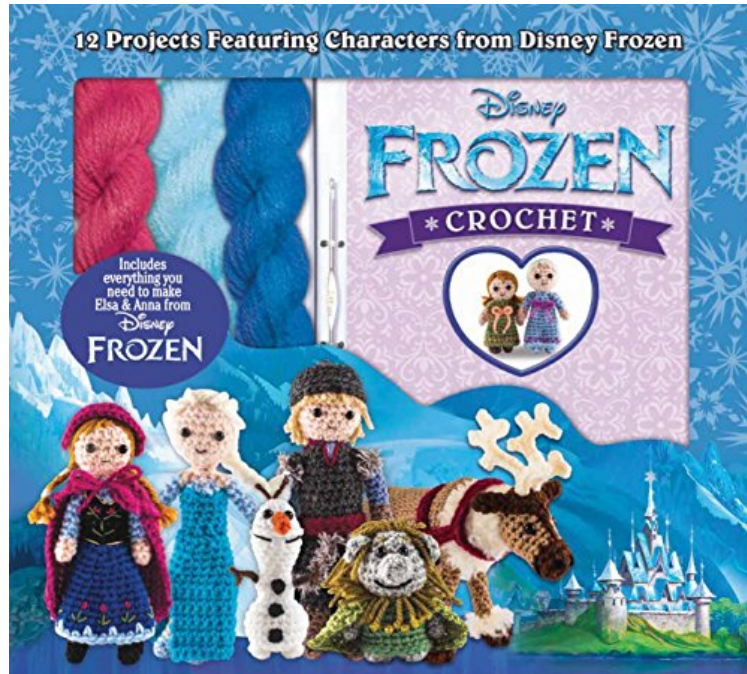

Twelve Frozen Character Figures in Amigurumi By iiiireader[[VIDEOID:4cfc6492d271628d757e4ac014d279f0]] I am impressed by the quality of this kit with the exception of the crochet hook which is average. The kit includes enough yarn to finish one each of two Frozen characters adult Queen Elsa and Princess Anna. After that, you will need to purchase additional yarn, fiberfill, safety eyes, and other assorted items to finish more of the characters. The kit does call for light worsted weight or DK acrylic yarn but does not tell what type of yarn was used. While it does not state it exactly, I would hazard a guess that that is what is included. The exception is Marshmallow, who is made of a bulky acrylic yarn. The safety eyes included in this kit are much better suited for amigurumi figures than the ones I have from other kits by this company. It probably depends on what the designer calls for but the 5mm eyes fit better than the larger 12mm I have received in those other kits (but not used) previously. All of the human figures call for 5mm, the animals call for 6mm and Marshmallow's eyes are embroidered on. If you are making these for a young child, you could consider doing the embroidered eyes on all of your figures. The book includes instructions for 12 figures, including: Queen Elsa, Princess Anna, Kristoff, Prince Hans, Oaken, Young Elsa, Young Anna, Young Kristoff, Sven, Grand Pabbie, Olaf, and Marshmallow. There are eight colors of yarn included in the kit. They are: light blue, turquoise, royal blue, magenta, pale peach, ivory, orange and black. Also included is a tapestry needle for seaming the figures and adding details with the included cotton embroidery floss (black, yellow, magenta, and green), light blue tulle, an inexpensive crochet hook in size 3.25 (US D/3), four 5 mm plastic safety eyes and fiberfill. There are also fairly detailed instructions including many diagrams from the basics to more advanced concepts including embroidery stitches (especially for Princess Anna's

clothing.) Unfortunately, there are no directions included for how to place the safety eyes. I am sure that this information can be found on the internet with a simple search. The directions do tell you exactly where to place the eyes. I will consider using these eyes if I can find similar ones for my other characters. Either that or I will buy consistent ones or embroider eyes on using basic satin stitches or the instructions used for Marshmallow. While the yarn in this kit is a good quality, I will be using my own stash to be sure that the sizes, colors, look, and feel of my characters are consistent. The instructions are detailed but I don't think that this is a project for most beginners. It uses techniques that crocheters with a bit more experience would feel comfortable with. If you are a beginner, just be sure you have access to someone or a website that can give you answers if you have any questions about the crochet and embroidery instructions. The hook is also okay but I prefer to use my own for ergonomic reasons as well as personal preference. The characters look to be fairly small - if you want to make them larger, use thicker yarn and larger hooks. The instructions should work well no matter the size. The tapestry needle is decent and works well for its purpose. When I get items in a kit that I don't use, I hold onto them and give them to someone I am teaching how to crochet so their expensive is limited right at first. I always try to give or donate rather than toss something out. I also love the idea of teaching young kids handwork from an early age and suggest that as a great way to give back. Handwork is something that can seem frightening the older you get but young kids have not fears! I have purchased and crocheted figures from other kits from this company (Star Wars, Disney Princesses, Peanuts, and Classic Disney) as well as one distributed by another company but which looks exactly like this brand with a slightly different box (Disney Winnie the Pooh). The instructions in the kits are all very similar as are the materials. I have been very impressed with the previous kits and believe this one will be just as good and recommend it to an intermediate or above crocheter without hesitation. 3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. although I was determined and so far I have finished Elsa and she looks good.
