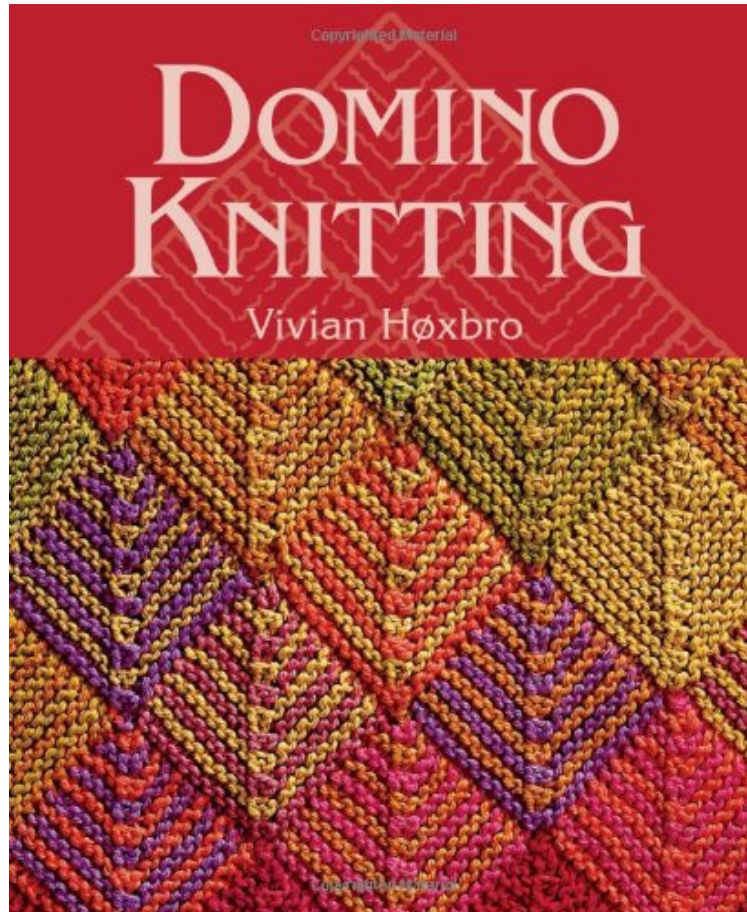

My only complaint is that the instructions are a little hard to follow; however a quick internet search produced numerous how to videos. Watching the video cleared up the confusion. Squares work quickly and it appears fairly easy. I think this technique will be great for projects while traveling. There is very little counting and it will be easy to put down and pick up.

Fun, eminently portable, and requiring nothing more than a knowledge of the basic knit and purl stitches, this technique has been popularized in recent years by Horst Schultz, whose Patchwork Knitting first attracted Hmxbro to the craft. While inspirational, Schultz's book is not the best choice for neophytes. Knitters wishing to master this technique would be well advised to work through this little book instead.
