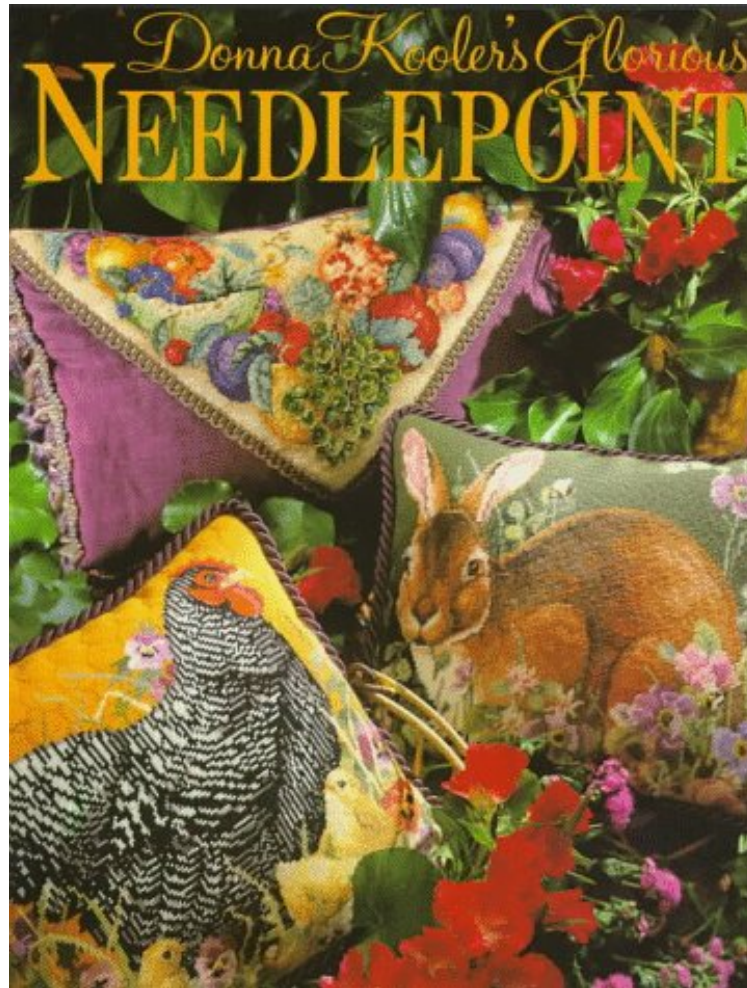

These designs, which employ continental or tent stitch on traditional needlepoint canvas, may easily be converted for cross-stitch on even-weave fabric. Projects, many with a seasonal theme, include pillows, pincushions, eyeglasses cases, and ornaments. Nonetheless, Kooler and crew have developed 25 projects definitely worth a stitch or two. Most of the patterns will appeal to those with conservative, realism-in-needlepoint preferences, such as cabbage roses and hen and chicks; but all are executed in exquisite detail with appropriate subtle color demarcations. In addition to charts of Persian yarns needed and finished sizes and four-color graphs to follow, each pattern includes finishing instructions. Nothing extraordinary, but everything in good taste.
