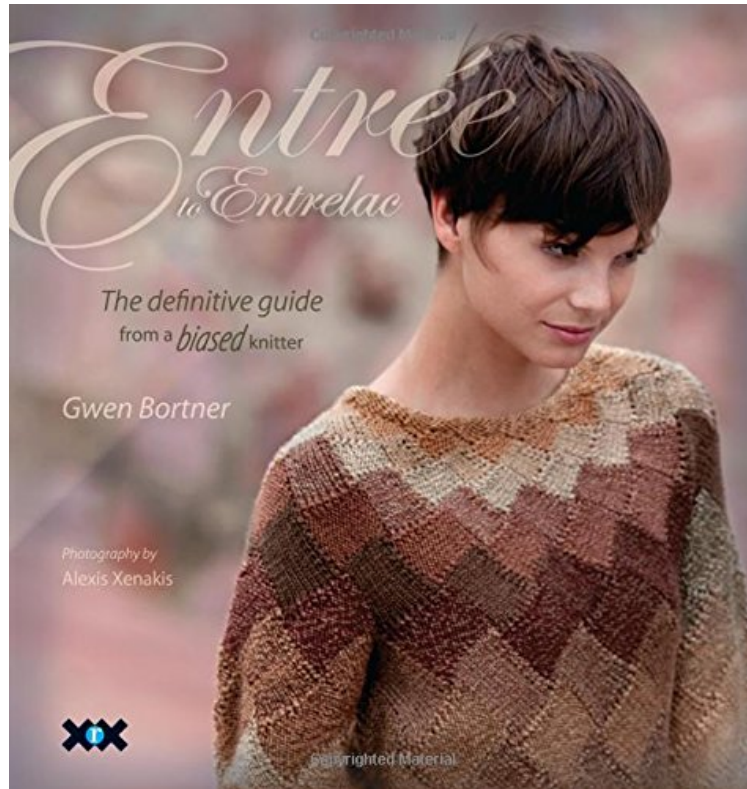

As an advanced knitter who has done many entrelac patterns, these pattern have totally baffled me. Now I have spent a significant amount on yarns for the Morning, Noon and Night pattern only to find after several attempts to work the pattern that it will just take too much time and effort to figure it out. It would have been so much better if more time had been spent actually showing how the pieces went together rather than how to knit and purl without turning your work. Too bad, beautiful patterns, horrible directions. This is the first time in my long history of knitting, crocheting and machine knitting that I have ever given up on a pattern. Do yourself a favor and find another book for entrelac and explore this fun knitting technique.5 of 5 people found the following review helpful. I am having trouble understanding the patterns in this book. The author seems to have made up her own system for writing patterns and makes things difficult to understand unnecessarily. I have other entrelac pattern books that take the "Tier" style of entrelac and make that in the the "row" style of pattern writing. I do like that the author seems to have removed

seaming from every pattern. I HATE to seem and the idea that I can make use of the unique flow of entrelac to eliminate it is wonderful. Overall I still plan to make many of the patterns, but the extra work I will have to put into understanding them means I will have to put it off till I have the time to rewrite each one before picking up my needles. 4 of 4 people found the following review helpful. I'll persevere but would not recommend this book for beginners unless you take the accompanying course. I'd recommend you get the book Entralac by Rosemary Drysdale first. It has easier to follow the instructions and many more pattern ideas
