The very first project is a sky blue Snow Queen Coat that any little girl would love. It has a lovely lace pattern and clear instructions. It even comes with a little knit capelet and hand muff. The Little Red Riding Hood cape in red is perfect for the girl in your life. It is knit with a relatively simple lace pattern. There are several elf designs including slippers and stockings for anyone who loves to felt. The Magic Carpet is adorable and can take your child to any destination of his dreams. It is knit in a colorful blue and green striped pattern with multi-colored triangle embellishments on the border. There are several pirate outfits for the guys, complete with skulls and crossbones. There's also a wonderful green Robin Hood jacket. I like that the book is balanced for gender - - outfits for

both boys and girls. There are crowns galore - - for princes, princesses, kings and queens. These are a bit easier to knit than some of the other projects in the book. There's a technique section that shows the various techniques and abbreviations used in the book. I like that the instructions are written out and not charted. I'm not a chart person. This is a whimsical and lovely book. By gail The clothes in here are of generous size and leave space for a child to grow and still have a wearable outfit. The patterns are interesting to work, but there are occasional mistakes that are easily fixed. Beginning knitters might find this frustrating. A little help from an experienced knitter would easily make the projects fun again. Use more stitch markers than you think you need. You can always drop some of them once the pattern is well established. I will definitely make some of these patterns over and over.
